In this very special service, the Bishop lays his hands upon our heads, speaks our name and prays for the strength of the Holy Spirit to fill our lives.






Eco Church: Caring for God's Earth

Help us to respond faithfully to the climate and nature crises

Eco Church is a scheme run by A Rocha UK, equipping churches to care for God's creation through their worship, buildings, land, community engagement, and individual lifestyles.

Essentially, the idea is that churches make a commitment to demonstrate their engagement with the environment by working towards an award.

There are five areas that a church must demonstrate environmental engagement with to receive an award:

- Worship and teaching
- Management of church buildings
- Management of church land
- Community and global engagement
- Lifestyle

According to the Church of England website: 'As of the end of 2022, there are 1155 Bronze, 401 Silver, and 23 Gold Church of England Eco Churches, and our first two gold cathedrals; Salisbury and Chelmsford. The scheme is a fantastic resource for encouraging churches, cathedrals, and dioceses to embody the fifth mark of mission.'

St. Mary's Churchyard Regulations – Easter

We are very conscious that this is a sensitive area – and we are most grateful for the care shown by many people tending graves and memorial plaques – but as Churchwardens we are required to ensure that the regulations laid down by the diocese relating to the churchyard are adhered to. The rules relating to churchyards are very stringent compared to those applying to local authority cemeteries. The full regulations are displayed on the noticeboard by the entrance and inside the South Door porch.

We would therefore ask that you remember that the placing of the likes of Easter Bunnies, windmills and so on, on graves/plaques is not permitted. Similarly floral remembrances should consist of natural flowers. Also please do not use glass vases or jars as they might be accidentally broken during mowing.

Whilst we should be reluctant to do so, we will, if necessary, remove items. We would always be happy to explain our reason for doing so. Please do speak with us if you would like advice about what is permitted.

Remembrances should be removed by Ascension Day (9 May) at the latest. Thank you. David & Robin, Churchwardens

Meadow Saxifrage, below, is already flowering in the St Mary's churchyard nature plot (in the front middle section)



Meadow Saxifrage

The delicate, snow-white, five petalled flowers and long stalked, kidney shaped leaves are distinctive features of the meadow saxifrage.

This is a declining species nationally with its stronghold in eastern England. It was once a common species on hay meadows and old grasslands but as these habitats have vanished so has the meadow saxifrage.



Hertingfordbury Parish News – February 1994



Last month we had a piece on the 30th anniversary of the ordination of women priests featuring our **Rev** Rosemary Caruana. This month Joan Haynes sent me an old copy of the Parish News from February 1994, 30 years ago! The Rector then was **Rev Jim Birtwistle** and Rosemary was Parish Deacon. The attached images and texts from that edition feature a letter from Rosemary regarding the Christmas services and Christingle as well as the arrangements for services at St John's lest we forget. Also Jean Walker was one of the churchwardens along with **John Wood**. They both did so much for St Mary's and of course in those days St John's Also highlighted is the mention within the magazine of the new tapestry work (runners, cushions & kneelers) for the Chancel & Sanctuary at St Mary's. This was all organised by **Richard Hitch** who also designed and drew the front covers of the magazines then and this one features the heraldic motifs used in






Volunteers needed to open/close St. Mary's

WALTER WALLINGER CHARITY

Walter Wallinger died in 1709 leaving "Four hundred pounds for the placing of poor children of this Parish as Apprentices."

Times have moved on and the trustees of the charity now take the view that the income from the endowment should be used to give grants for educational purposes to people under 25 who have for at least two years lived, or been educated, within'the ancient parish of Hertingfordbury' which today roughly means Hertingfordbury village and the five Greens and outlying houses.

Something of the order of £1500 is available annually. Typically grants are one-off payments not exceeding £450 for something that will help with the applicant's education in a broad sense, such as a musical instrument, specialist equipment, a field or other course. Grants are available to anyone in school, FE or Higher Education.
