Looking in: Isaiah 9.2-3

*The people who walked in darkness have seen  
a great light;*

*Those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness,  
upon them the light has dawned.*

*You have increased their joy and given them great gladness;*

*They rejoiced before you as with joy at the harvest.*

*For you have shattered the yoke that burdened them;*

*The collar that lay heavy on their shoulders.*

The eternal message of Christmas is that God met us in his Son. That His love and compassion were so great that our imperfections counted as nothing. We know, you and I, that it is the work of a lifetime to try to become more Christlike. The bridge between us and God can only be crossed because God made that possible.

Let's search now for those things which we are less than proud of, and ask God to lift those burdens. Let's allow God once again to shatter the yoke of our guilt and our self-disappointment.

### Looking forward – Luke 1:76-79



*And you child, shall be called the prophet  
of the Most High,  
For you will go before the Lord to prepare  
his way.*

*To give his people knowledge of salvation  
by the forgiveness of all their sins.*

*In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high  
shall break upon us,*

*To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of  
death,*

*And to guide our feet into the way of peace.*

These words are spoken by Zechariah about his son, John the Baptist. Yet they are also for us. They are for God's church and for each person who chooses to follow Christ. We have a job to do – to spread the Gospel message by word and action.
