

Becoming a Friend


The Friends of Hertingfordbury St Mary was granted charitable status just before Christmas (Charity number 1206041).

Hertingfordbury St Mary Charitable Giving

Like most other churches, St Mary's has historically given to charities as part of its mission within the community. This has in the past been amounts raised at specific events organised by the church. Quite obviously much depends on the success of the event and often those attending may not necessarily be aware of the charitable objective. Usually there have been two charities each year. One local and one national/international.

Your PCC have recently discussed this at some length and have come to the following decisions:

- It is felt a more structured and transparent approach is needed and therefore we have agreed that 5% of the church's income will be donated each year following the approved annual accounts
- The definition of "income" is very important. In this case income will mean basically what parishioners, congregations and visitors give through the Parish Giving Scheme, standing orders, envelopes and the plate in church (including weddings, funerals etc).
- Income will NOT include one off donations and legacies which often have restrictions attached anyway. Likewise all funds raised by The Friends of Hertingfordbury St Mary through events, membership fees or other means are strictly dedicated to the preservation and restoration of the church building and churchyard and would not be included.

St Mary's is so grateful for the generosity and financial commitment of its congregation and wider parish community, that we feel it is essential that this is a completely transparent and communicated process. Everyone who so kindly gives to the church must be fully aware of the charitable commitment within their giving.

Charitable Giving 2024

The following two charities have been nominated to receive our donations in 2024

- **Warrenwood Riding for the Disabled Association (RDA)** is a local charity based in Essendon. They provide a pony riding experience and therapy for disabled and special needs children from local special schools. It is run under the auspices of the RDA totally by volunteers.



Hertingfordbury St Mary Charitable Giving

- **Mercy Ships** is a global Christian charity whose aim is to bring hope and healing to those suffering from disability, disfigurement and disease. They deploy hospital ships and partner with African nations to transform surgical systems and provide free surgery to those most in need. Although an international organisation the UK branch is based in Stevenage. www.mercyships.org.uk

We can confirm that each of these charities will receive £835 this year

Eco Church: Caring for God's Earth

Help us to respond faithfully to the climate and nature crises

Eco Church is a scheme run by A Rocha UK, equipping churches to care for God's creation through their worship, buildings, land, community engagement, and individual lifestyles.

Essentially, the idea is that churches make a commitment to demonstrate their engagement with the environment by working towards an award.

There are five areas that a church must demonstrate environmental engagement with to receive an award:

- Worship and teaching
- Management of church buildings
- Management of church land
- Community and global engagement
- Lifestyle

According to the Church of England website: 'As of the end of 2022, there are 1155 Bronze, 401 Silver, and 23 Gold Church of England Eco Churches, and our first two gold cathedrals; Salisbury and Chelmsford. The scheme is a fantastic resource for encouraging churches, cathedrals, and dioceses to embody the fifth mark of mission.'

Ordination of Women as Priests

This March marked a milestone in the history of the Church of England – 30 years since the historic first ordination of women as priests. To mark this significant anniversary, and to give thanks for the remarkable contributions of the ministry of women over the past three decades, the Diocese held a special service of celebration in St Albans Cathedral on Saturday 9 March.



Our very own Rosemary Caruana (sitting front left) was invited and participated in the service and celebration. Rosemary was our Priest in Charge at St Mary's from 1998 until 2005. She took over from Rev Jim Birtwistle and was of course followed by Rev Alan Stewart who thankfully is still with us today 18 years later!

We give thanks and prayers for the service and devotion that Rosemary has given and still gives to our church and wider community.

Ordination of Women Priests

The Revd Christina Rees CBE was invited to preach a sermon at the service. Christina lived and ministered in the Diocese of St Albans for 35 years, served on the Church's General Synod for 25 years and was Chair of WATCH, advocating for the ordination of women bishops and striving for gender equality within the Church. In recognition of her contributions to the Church of England, she was awarded CBE in 2015.

In her sermon, Christina reflected on the Church's journey to ordain women as deacons, priests and bishops, recounting the story of the Revd Dr Florence Li Tim-Oi, the first woman ordained as a priest in the Anglican Communion, in 1944 during World War II.

Sharing her thoughts on the struggle for acceptance and recognition women faced within the church, Christina highlighted the resistance and then the change that led to the ordination of women. She spoke of the initial reluctance of figures such as Archbishop Robert Runcie, who, influenced by his encounter with Dr Li Tim-Oi, eventually supported the movement towards gender equality in ministry.

Quoting Saint Catherine of Siena, Christina encouraged all to "be who you were created to be, and you will set the world on fire."

St. Mary's Churchyard Regulations – Easter



We are very conscious that this is a sensitive area – and we are most grateful for the care shown by many people tending graves and memorial plaques – but as Churchwardens we are required to ensure that the regulations laid down by the diocese relating to the churchyard are adhered to. The rules relating to churchyards are very stringent compared to those applying to local authority cemeteries. The full regulations are displayed on the noticeboard by the entrance and inside the South Door porch.

We would therefore ask that you remember that the placing of the likes of Easter Bunnies, windmills and so on, on graves/plaques is not permitted. Similarly floral remembrances should consist of natural flowers. Also please do not use glass vases or jars as they might be accidentally broken during mowing.

Whilst we should be reluctant to do so, we will, if necessary, remove items. We would always be happy to explain our reason for doing so. Please do speak with us if you would like advice about what is permitted.

Remembrances should be removed by Ascension Day (9 May) at the latest.



Encounters with Jesus on Our Streets

I have had more encounters with Jesus on the streets of our town than in church. This somewhat heretical statement can't be true, can it? I certainly used to be confused as to why this should be. After talking to many people, I realise why this might be the case - if you walk out in faith, God walks with you. On the streets I'm totally reliant on God; I pray to him for safety, wisdom, insight and for God's help in identifying vulnerable individuals that we can help. One of the truisms of the Street Pastor ministry is that God answers prayer on the streets. We see it all the time and it can be anything from a truly "wow" moment, to a God of small things moment. I want to share one such God of small things encounter.



On a Street Pastor patrol back in Autumn of 2022 at about 2am on a Saturday morning in Bull Plain, Hertford; we were looking after one youngster whose drink had been spiked. He was unconscious, sprawled against the little bridge leading into Folly Island. Some of the team stayed with him until an ambulance could attend. We had taken our large winter coats off to keep him warm. At the same time, the rest of the team were looking after a very drunk teenage girl outside PopWorld. We covered her in a blanket to protect her modesty and a street pastor coat to keep her warm, as we waited, until mum could collect her. I was the patrol leader on that night and as I was hurrying between these two incidents a fight was about to breakout outside of PopWorld.

A young man was aggressively swearing at the top of his voice at one of the door staff from the club. His girlfriend was hysterical and screaming at him to stop, but he wasn't listening, and his body language was changing as he moved from posturing into preparing to fight. The doorman was also preparing for the coming conflict. I was very much in "Martha-mode" (Luke 10:38-42), a Samaritan trying to help vulnerable people in the town. As I walked past, I moved into a "Mary-mode" and prayed for God to intervene in this situation. Immediately the young man's posture changed, he was much less aggressive, and he was for the first time listening to his girlfriend, who also had calmed down, whilst the door man had changed his stance to a much more conciliatory tone. I was somewhat embarrassed at how quickly and fully my prayer had been answered. Isn't prayer supposed to be hard work? But here a simple pray, with my mind focussed elsewhere was answered instantly




Volunteers needed to open/close St. Mary's

WALTER WALLINGER CHARITY

Walter Wallinger died in 1709 leaving "Four hundred pounds for the placing of poor children of this Parish as Apprentices."

Times have moved on and the trustees of the charity now take the view that the income from the endowment should be used to give grants for educational purposes to people under 25 who have for at least two years lived, or been educated, within 'the ancient parish of Hertingfordbury' which today roughly means Hertingfordbury village and the five Greens and outlying houses.

Something of the order of £1500 is available annually. Typically grants are one-off payments not exceeding £450 for something that will help with the applicant's education in a broad sense, such as a musical instrument, specialist equipment, a field or other course. Grants are available to anyone in school, FE or Higher Education.


