Maybe we can all stock up on that emergency confetti for those good-news moments of others.

Joan Emily Haynes (17 January 1931 – 22 May 2024) - Tributes

Joan was born in Hertford and lived almost her entire life in Hertingfordbury and the Greens. She was baptised, confirmed, married and with her passing, buried at St Mary's Church, Hertingfordbury. She and husband Arthur had such an enormous presence and gave so much to our community it is only right that we share the thoughts and tributes of her family and friends.

Joanna, Philippa and all the family would like to thank everybody who attended the funeral and to thank all the friends and wider community that have given Joan constant love and support, especially in her last few difficult years and months.

Below are extracts from the eulogies of her daughter Joanna and close friend Mary.

Daughter Joanna

"Firstly on behalf of the myself and Philippa we would like to thank everyone today who has come to celebrate the life of our mum. Unfortunately we lost our dear dad Arthur during covid and could not celebrate his life and so this day is for both of them. She was brought up as an only child which for many people can be lonely existence. This was not the case for mum as she had many Aunts and Uncles she could call upon as family who in turn produced a wealth of cousins who became her extended family. She really valued family and friendships more than anything else.

She was fiercely independent working in the heart of London in the 1950s – telling us how she would go up to London on the steam train and how she enjoyed going out to the theatre and restaurants at this time even though she said she was a country girl at heart. Working until she was nearly 80 years old, she said it kept her young.

Mum and Dad met at a dance locally and married in this very church on 6th September 1958. They moved to the Bury in 1964 and made our forever home in the village. Being part of everyday village life was important to them. Dad made games for the village fete which are still being used today.

Mum had three great passions in life. Her grandchildren, cooking, and sport.

She loved seeing her four grandchildren make their way in the world and to hear stories about their adventures, watching them play sport and was always on hand to offer timely advice and guidance.

Cooking was her other love. She was an excellent cook and cake maker. For her a dry cake would be a tragedy. Always offering great hospitality, you never went hungry if you came to our house.

Sport was her other passion. She was a keen tennis player and we spent many happy hours as a family at the tennis court with other families from the Bury. Mum was still keeping fit attending Aqua aerobic sessions into her 80s.

Watching all types of sport, football, tennis, rugby, cricket and even curling, often into the middle of the night. You named the sport, and she would have watched it, could tell you the result and give her opinion on the performance.

Finally I return to the family and friends theme. Mum could spot a card shop from a mile away and have a 30-minute walk round the shop selecting cards. Many people here today would have received a card from our mum. We can honestly say she picked those cards and made sure they were individual to the person she was sending them to.

Mum we will miss your kind and warm smile, your love, your advice and guidance and of course your cakes!! You will now be in heaven with our dear dad – so as you would say to us. Goodnight and God Bless and send our love to Dad!"

Close friend Mary

"It's not what we have in life, but WHO we have in our life that matters. Joan Haynes, my friend for almost 60 years was one of the kindest and most loyal of friends who never said an unkind word about anybody. I met Joan in 1964 when she and Arthur moved from Cole Green to 1, St. Mary's Lane. We lived in the Lodge, next to this church.

At that time our two families had the only young children in the village and from thence onwards we shared many joys and a few sorrows.

Joan was very much a local girl. She was born in Hertford County Hospital, then lived in Bengoe for a short time and from there moved to Cole Green and then to Birch Green. She married a local boy Arthur whom she met at a dance. So, she didn't move far.

Joan attended the Hertingfordbury Cowper Primary School, then Ware Grammar School for girls and on leaving school joined the Midland Bank, working in London and then in Welwyn Garden City.

When the tennis court and pavilion were built in Hertingfordbury Joan and Arthur were very much part of that project. Many Sunday afternoons were spent playing tennis, picnicking by the pavilion and sampling some of Joan's homemade cakes.

Family was the centre of Joan's life and the Jansens were included in this extended family.

Joan and I did many things together. She had a great love of reading and we were constantly swapping books. She always kept me the St Mary's Parish Magazine. We joined the local W.I. and when we were singing the hymn Jerusalem Joan knew all the words by heart.

Joan was also very much part of Hertingfordbury working life. After Philippa and Joanna went to school she worked in the office of Wheatley and Knight and then later worked in the office of Harry Shepherd. For many years Joan and Arthur were on the cleaning rota of her beloved church. St. Mary's Church was very much part of Joan's life. Her father rang bells in the church. She was baptized here, confirmed and married here. Philippa and Joanna were also baptized, confirmed and married in St Mary's. Her parents and Arthur lie at rest in the cemetery. Joan often talked about joining her beloved Arthur. Joan's faith and her acceptance of death was a remarkable example to us all.

I will finish with an Irish proverb. A GOOD FRIEND IS LIKE A 4 LEAFED CLOVER. HARD TO FIND BUT LUCKY TO HAVE.

Eternal rest grant unto you Joan and let perpetual light shine upon you. May you rest in peace."

What have we been doing?

Having conversations

The article on Eco Church in the newsletter has generated quite a bit of interest and a lot of informal conversations. It turns out that quite a number of us would like to be involved at some level. So it is planned to convene a more formal meeting soon. We are also tapping into the experience of those at St Andrew's who are further along in their journey towards the Bronze Award.

Thinking about energy saving

It seems that quite a number of us are interested in energy saving. We have been talking about the possibility of installing new generation infra red panels. Next steps include a conversation with St Andrew's church, who are thinking along similar lines and a visit to Hertford Castle at September's Eco Fest, where it will be possible to look at examples in situ, as well as Air Source Heat Pumps and other innovations. An energy audit of the church is also planned.

Awayday pledges

Some of us at St Mary's took part in the session on *Evaluating the Natural World* at the April Away Day in St Joseph's in the Park and made pledges to support our natural environment. Others celebrated the natural world in art, using natural found objects to create a piece of artwork.

Nature in the churchyard

We have been looking at the range of wild nature in the churchyard and created a page on the website to post pictures of what we have seen for everyone to appreciate. Next steps will be to look at ways in which we can foster and encourage even more species in this lovely space.

In our churchyard – More Wild Nature

As we said earlier, we have been looking at the range of wild nature in the churchyard and created a page on the website to post pictures of what we have seen for everyone to appreciate. We continue this month with more examples below. Our churchyard at St Mary's is a very special space and is there for everyone to enjoy in their own personal way. Next steps will be to look at ways in which we can foster and encourage even more species in this lovely space. Here are further examples



Green alkanet
(*pentaglossis*)

From the Borage family, historically, the roots of Green Alkanet were used to make a red dye. Its nectar rich flowers are attractive to bees, hoverflies and butterflies and its leaves are food for the larvae of the scarlet tiger moth.



Cow parsley (*anthriscus sylvestris*)

Also known as Queen Anne's lace, this wildflower is very popular with pollinators such as bees and hoverflies, as an early source of pollen.



Wych elm (*ulmus glabra*)

One of the few native British trees, the Wych Elm provides food for birds who eat its seeds and the leaves are a source of nutrition for the caterpillars of many moths including the white spotted pinion.



Rough hawkbit (*leontodon hispidus*)

Hawkbit is a beautiful meadow flower, beloved of bees for its sweet nectar. Goldfinches and other birds love its seeds too

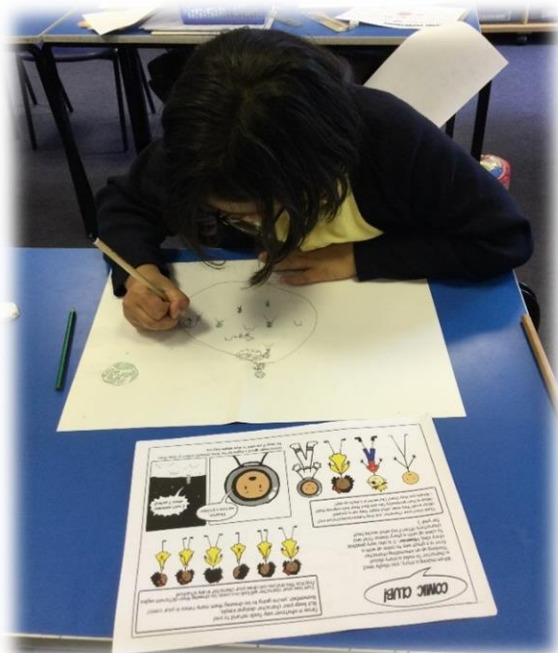
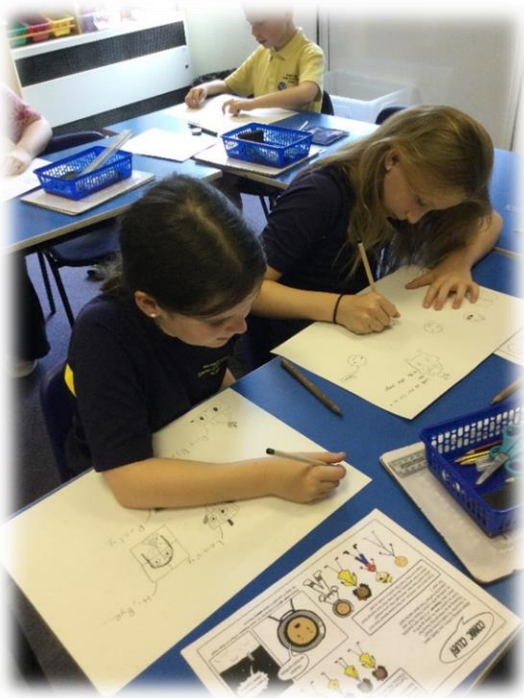


Hertingfordbury Cowper C of E (VA) Primary School

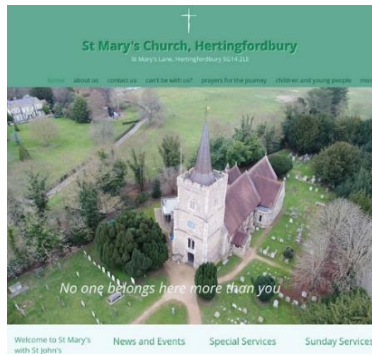

WALTER WALLINGER CHARITY

Walter Wallinger died in 1709 leaving "Four hundred pounds for the placing of poor children of this Parish as Apprentices."

Times have moved on and the trustees of the charity now take the view that the income from the endowment should be used to give grants for educational purposes to people under 25 who have for at least two years lived, or been educated, within 'the ancient parish of Hertingfordbury' which today roughly means Hertingfordbury village and the five Greens and outlying houses.

Something of the order of £1500 is available annually. Typically grants are one-off payments not exceeding £450 for something that will help with the applicant's education in a broad sense, such as a musical instrument, specialist equipment, a field or other course. Grants are available to anyone in school, FE or Higher Education.

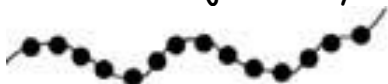

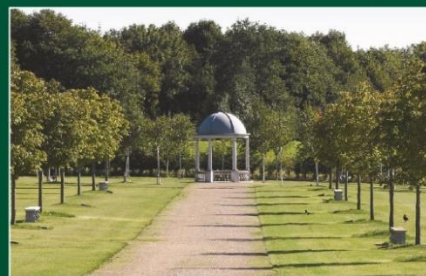
