#### **FIRST FOOT**

I'm never quite sure when the cut-off point for wishing someone a Happy New Year is. I suspect it's mid to late January, but this being the first magazine of 2025, I'd like to wish you all a very Happy and Healthy New Year!

Some of us will be familiar with the Scottish and Northern English tradition of First-Footing, where the first person (the First Foot) who steps over the threshold of a home after midnight on New Year's Day brings good luck and blessing. Traditionally, they come bearing gifts which are symbolic of that blessing. These can include a silver coin for prosperity, some shortbread for hospitality, a lump of coal for warmth and a dram of whisky for good cheer!

First Footing is a hopeful thing. As we gaze out into the unchartered territory of 2025, do we look with hope or with a measure of trepidation? It's easy to look at the state of the world, and perhaps at our own private world, and feel daunted or hopeless.

The musician Nick Cave writes that 'Hope is an emotional temper that emboldens the heart to be active... it's a feat of the imagination, both courageous and ingenious, a vitality that inspires us to take innovative action to defend the world. Hope is essential to our surviving and our flourishing and we achieve this by rejecting the relentless promotion of despair and opening our eyes to the beauty of things, however imperilled, degraded or difficult to love the world may appear to be'.

For me, the secret of hope is to invite Christ to be the First Foot of each day, remembering

that He also goes ahead into the unknown and is already there waiting.

In 1939 as the country was preparing for war, George VI in his Christmas broadcast quoted an obscure poet called Minnie Louise Haskins... perhaps 86 years later these words might be just as helpful as we step into the next unseen chapters of our lives:

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown."

And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."



#### HARRY RUNS FOR NATIONAL ECZEMA SOCIETY

This coming April, Harry Longman will be running the London Marathon. He is fundraising for the National Eczema Society (NES), a charity which means a lot to him having suffered from a severe form of eczema throughout his life.

Harry says, "In January 2024, I suffered from an intense three month flare-up covering 75% of my body which had a drastic effect on my physical and mental wellbeing. For this entire period, I was

unable to sleep for more than one hour in the night. Wearing clothes, showering, and moving in general was extremely painful. Thankfully, after many hospital visits and dermatology appointments I was able to get the condition under control. Thousands of people are suffering from eczema daily, some as severely as my case. I am going through the pain of running the London Marathon on behalf of those people, as a sign of gratitude that I was able to get my life back, and on behalf of the great work that NES do."

NES provides vital support services such as helplines, support groups and online resources that help suffering individuals and families cope. The funds contribute to research initiatives aimed at understanding the causes of eczema and develop better treatments with the hope of one day finding a cure for all.

You might get the opportunity to speak to Harry after a 10.30 Sunday service and ask him how his training is going. Please help Harry reach his target of £2,000. Any donation large or small will be greatly appreciated.

#### BUMPER CHRISTMAS ATTENDANCES GENEROUS CONGREGATIONS

Advent and Christmas saw many more people entering the doors of St Andrew's to attend the various events and services held over the festive season.

For <u>Beer & Carols</u> over 300 adults and children were welcomed through the doors over the course of the afternoon with money raised for the **Hertford Pantry**. A beautiful candlelit service of <u>Lessons and Carols</u> was attended by about 125 people. The collection went to **Herts Young Homeless**.

The two <u>Crib and Christingle Services</u> on Christmas Eve attracted 530 adults and children. The collections at these services always go to **The Children's Society.** 

The <u>Christmas Day Services</u> – Midnight Mass, 8am Christmas Day and the All Age on Christmas Day. We felt it appropriate that we should remember the Holy Land on this day and so our collection went to **Christian Aid's Middle East Appeal**.

Finally a boot full of generously donated gifts was delivered to **Haven First** which provides support to those experiencing homelessness in Stevenage and North Hertfordshire and was gratefully received.

It was a joy to see so many people worshipping the Christ Child in so many ways and to witness people's generosity towards those in need. Thank you to everyone who gave of their time, their money and gifts over this period.

#### A DEFIBRILLATOR AT ST ANDREW'S

The PCC has agreed to the purchase of a defibrillator for the church. In recent years, the need for access to these machines has been well publicised and we have decided to have an installation inside the church building.

We hope to access some money from grants and we will also be raising funds at the coffee mornings in February and March. All being well, we can have a machine in situ by the summer.

The defibrillator also will be accessible to the general public during the hours when our building is open. The PCC considered whether to have the installation outside and at the front of the church but agreed that, while this was the most desirable situation, it would be considerably more expensive and would take time while we overcome challenges regarding the supply of electrical power and finding an exact location that was both appropriate and acceptable to the diocese, from whom permission would be required.

The PCC agreed we should go ahead as quickly as possible while, in the longer term, continuing to look for alternative solutions for an external installation.





#### CHILDREN'S ACTIVITIES



Hertford Children's Choir is a choir led by Rachel and Sam Chaplin for anyone aged 8-13\* who loves singing and wants to develop their musicianship. Rehearsals are on Fridays 5.30-6.45pm at St Andrew's Church Hertford and there are termly performances.

The choir sing a range of folk songs, rounds, gospel songs and classical pieces, as well as songs written especially for them by Sam and Rachel. Warm-ups and simple songs are taught by ear and other pieces are taught with sheet music. Choir members learn the basics of reading music and singing in harmony. The choir will suit children with natural musical aptitude but no prior musical experience is needed and there's no audition requirement to join.

The choir perform in concerts and at community events and also perform every term within a service at St Andrew's. There is a termly membership contribution of £50 and a £10 joining fee which includes the choir concert t-shirt. Assisted places are available.

#### "DEANERY CHAT" AND MUTUAL SUPPORT GROUPS

Shirley Taylor brings news of the latest Hertford and Ware Deanery Synod meeting

Your Deanery Synod reps, Jenny Aitken, Renee Booker and Shirley Taylor ventured out on a cold night to travel to Ware for the meeting at St Mary's. After a complete circuit of the church in the dark across path, grass and flower bed we found the door into the warm hall and were welcomed with a cup of tea and a mince pie.

The meeting started with a presentation by the Diocesan Giving Officer, Kate Ford, whose post is funded by the Church of England, not the Diocese. She outlined principles of fundraising and regular giving, addressing newer methods of collecting money such as card readers and online giving pages. They are able to come and advise Parishes if they wish.

We then accepted the reports from the Diocesan Board of Finance and Diocesan Synod. Clergy stipends will rise by 3% in 2025 and the Parish Share, the amount the parishes contribute to the Diocese, will be £14,567,000 to be apportioned in accordance with the approved Parish Shares Scheme (ie numbers attending churches, percentage of full-time ministers etc.) The majority of this money is used to pay salaries in the parishes and at Diocese.

The Diocese also discussed 'Living in Love and Faith' and 'Growing Younger and More Diverse' and the 'Net Zero Carbon Action Plan'.

Deanery Synod was then asked to sign up for and recruit people from Parishes to contribute and share matters to which they feel committed. The deanery-wide (Hertford, Ware and villages) online

#### What is the Deanery Synod?

The Deanery Synod is the church governance equivalent of a district council. It comprises elected lay members from the parishes and serving clergy.

groups are set up to assist our partnership in the gospel.

- The Environment
- Fresh Expressions
- Growing Younger and More Diverse
- New Development
- Parish Share and Finances (a good one for treasurers to join)
- Social Action.
- Churchwardens' Group

The simplest one everyone can join is the "Deanery Chat" group which is an open forum, largely for communicating about events that are taking place in our churches. If you share something there, all the group's members will be notified - this is easy advertising amongst the churches of the deanery. It's also a where members can place share encouragements about what God is doing in and through their churches.

These groups are designed to be mutual support groups for those who have a particular interest or position in the church involving these matters.

the Just log into website (hertfordandwaredeanery.org.uk) select "Members" menu, the "Social Community" sub-menu and then "Groups" to find the list. Scroll the page to the group you want and click "Request membership."

Finally, Shirley was elected to fill the Casual Lay Vacancy for Diocesan Synod.

### **OUR WORLD**

JENNY MUTCH SHARES HER THOUGHTS ON CLIMATE CHANGE IN ACTION

Recently, Forbes and I were in New Zealand. We realise that our travel was not ideal for our individual carbon footprints so we will be doing our best to offset this in the coming months (cycling, walking, minimal heating etc)! However, our travels gave us an opportunity to see first-hand the impact of industrialisation and associated global temperature change on our natural world. The Franz Josef glacier in South Island, New Zealand, once a mighty force of nature has retreated some 3km since the late 1800s with 500m of this in 2023 alone (just one year)!





The sea in Milford Sound was warm enough for us to swim in and dolphins were spotted in areas where they don't normally venture, drawn by the same warmer water and food. All this got me asking the question; what exactly are we doing to combat climate change?

#### **The Paris Agreement**

On the 12<sup>th</sup> December 2015, a commitment (now known as the Paris Agreement) was made between 193 counties, plus the European Union, aimed at preventing global temperatures from rising by more than 1.5°C. The target was based on scientific evidence suggesting that increases above this level would lead to severe climate impact, resulting in weather extremes such as more flooding, heatwaves and severe drought.

Each year the meteorological scientific community provides up-dated climate-change predictions. Sadly, current climate models suggest alarming global warming rates of 3.1°C by 2100; for many of us that is during the lifetimes of our children or, if not our children, then our grandchildren.

#### The statistics

We are already seeing changes in our weather patterns often attributed to climate change. We may discuss what we can do at home groups and/or around our dinner tables, but the international statistics are scary suggesting that all governments also need to act fast and be prepared to invest heavily (together with private companies) in technologies that focus on rapid carbon dioxide emission reductions.

Depending on which newspaper or research journal you read, figures differ slightly, but the overall message is clear:

- China and United States contribute around 40% of total carbon dioxide emissions.
- India and Russia are responsible for another 12 - 15%.

The European Union contributes 25 - 30%.

Perhaps it is not surprising these countries/areas are top of the league due to their size, but when you look at the figures per person capita/year in tonnes, the picture becomes more worrying, with the United States contributing 15 tonnes per capita/year, followed by Russia at 13 and China at 8. As a comparison, the UK's figure is 5 tonnes: still, too much to make a significant difference in the fight for temperature reduction.

The good news? Many European Union countries have significantly reduced their carbon emissions in the last year. Bulgaria tops the bill at 23% with Estonia, Finland, Germany, Slovenia and Hungary all with reductions of around 10%. The UK managed 4%.

The bad news? You've guessed it! Many countries are showing an increase, including large population countries such as China, Russia and India.

The result? An overall world increase in carbon dioxide emissions.

#### **Prayer and Campaigning**

So, let us spread the word where we can that this is an issue that needs immediate attention and collectively pray that the climate agenda moves from words to actions now!

'We pray that the decisions made during COP29 [and elsewhere] won't be empty words. We ask that those in positions of power be held accountable to the targets set, working with conviction to go above and beyond them. 



