Intercessions 21 Oct 2018

Readings: Isaiah 53 4-end; Mark 10: 35-45

Happy are those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or take the path that sinners tread, or sit in the seat of scoffers; but their delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law that meditate day and night.

They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper. (Psalm 1:1-3)

Lord, we have heard today of servant leadership prophesied by Isaiah and modelled by Jesus.
