Collect and Readings

Collect: Eternal God, in the stillness of this night you sent your almighty Word to pierce the world's darkness with the light of salvation: give to the earth the peace that we long for and fill our hearts with the joy of heaven through our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

First Reading: Isaiah 9. 2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.
