"When I first read 'The Prophetic Imagination' in 2004......I was struck by how Brueggemann roots discipleship in a radical commitment to act in solidarity with the disinherited, dismantling the evils of empire or, as he would have put it, the "royal consciousness". Brueggemann pointed out that throughout the Bible, kings and military leaders embodied a way of thinking concerned with the acquisition of power or wealth, often at the expense of the most vulnerable in society. He noted that this "royal consciousness" was repeatedly rebuked by the prophets and ultimately Jesus."
